Curriculum

Level 1

Personal Growth

No credit is received. Student does not need to take test or turn in papers. Students must purchase books and study guides. Classroom discussion participation is required.

	Instructor	Lessons	Audit	Credit
Bible History 1	Richard Rogers	24		
A chronological study of the people, places, times, and events of the Old Testament. This course covers Genesis through Deuteronomy.				
The Sacrificial System	Gerald Paden	12		
A focused study of the major sacrifices in the Law of Moses, centered in the book of Leviticus. Learn how these sacrifices were offered, how they related to the Jews, and how they relate to Christians today. See also how they foreshadowed the one all-sufficient sacrifice of Jesus Christ.				
Bible History 2	Richard Rogers	24		
A chronological study of the people, places, times, and events of the Old Testament. This course covers Joshua through Malachi.				
Psalms	Charles Speer	24		
The psalms reveal both the heart of God and the wide spectrum of human emotion and experience. This study introduces the literary styles of the psalms, and takes the student through a survey of all types of psalms, including praise psalms, imprecatory psalms, forgiveness psalms, and Messianic psalms.				
Isaiah	Richard Rogers	24		
This study of one of the most beautiful books of the Bible will cause you to better appreciate the working of God to bring His Messiah for the salvation of His people. Many prophecies about Jesus will be studied.				
Jeremiah	Dayton Keesee	24		
The prophecies of Jeremiah come from a heart that is ripping apart in pain for an unbelieving people. This study will show us the heart of God, His love for His people, and His justice and mercy.				
Daniel	Ted Stewart	12		
This course is a study of an Old Testament book, which has been neglected by many Bible students and perhaps overlooked by others. The very nature of the book--containing much figurative language--has given rise to a wide variety of ideas. This course strives to be an honest and balanced study and evaluation of those ideas.				
Minor Prophets	Richard Rogers	24		

Although the prophets were speaking to the house of Israel, the concepts these books contain are relevant to our modern day world. You will be lifted high with the realization that God not only works in the lives of individuals, but also in the affairs of nations.

The Life of Christ	Richard Rogers	24		
A detailed overview of the teachings and works of Jesus Christ, from His birth to His resurrection and the various phases of His ministry in between.				
Gospel of John	Doyle Gilliam	24		
The book of John was written to create faith in unbelievers — faith that Jesus is the Christ and that, through that faith, eternal life could be had. This study digs deep into the text of John's gospel, including the seven signs John used to show the world that Jesus is the Son of God, and thus deity.				
Acts	Abe Lincoln	24		
Action is what it is all about! This study moves, showing the action of both godly and ungodly people as they react to the message of Jesus. The challenge of this study is one of duplicating the enthusiasm and growth of the early church. Note: This is an exegetical study of Acts, with emphasis on the doctrinal applications it contains. For a less detailed, more historical survey of Acts, see our course "The Church in the Book of Acts" below.				
The Church in Acts	Richard Rogers	12		
A survey of the dynamic growth of the early church, along with the challenges encountered along the way, and the beginning of missions. This study contains many useful applications for Christians and churches seeking growth. Note: This is a historical overview of Acts, with emphasis on the example of the early church and its growth. For a more in-depth doctrinal study of Acts, see our course "Acts" above.				
Romans	Richard Rogers	24		
An in-depth and inspiring study of the book of Romans, in which we learn about the need for righteousness, God's provision of righteousness, and our experience of living a life of righteousness.				
1 Corinthians	Abe Lincoln	22		
The purpose of this first letter to Corinth was two-fold: (1) to correct the problems which existed in that congregation, and (2) to answer questions which they had asked Paul. In this course Abe Lincoln meets these problems and questions head on as he discusses also the underlying				

Elective Courses

Apologetics 1: Historical Christian Evidences Ed Wharton 12

A course presenting the objective nature of the basic beliefs of the Christian religion. Topics covered include Jesus as a person in history, the accuracy of the New Testament writings, and the evidence for the identity, character, and resurrection of Jesus.

Apologetics 2: New Discoveries Ted Stewart This detailed study of Christian apologetics covers a lot of important ground, starting with evidence and logical reasoning related to the existence of God, the origins of the universe and of mankind, and the inspiration of the Bible. The instructor goes on to present recent archaeological and historical findings that shed light on Old Testament events and chronology.

Basics of Christian Counseling Ken Wilson, PhD This course prepares church leaders and other Christians to understand and help others. While certain mental health needs of individuals require the care of a specialist or professional, many fundamental needs can be ministered to by loving, caring, trained Christians. This course is a step in that direction.

Biblical Interpretation Charles Speer This course will provide insight into ways to study the Bible and will suggest some tools with which to enhance your study. Charles Speer methodically takes you step by step through various ways you should approach a study of the Bible.

Biblical Theology of Missions Richard Rogers This study examines the very foundations of the gospel message and of the call to spread it throughout the world. Beginning with the sovereignty of God Himself, the study delves into missions principles, the nature of the gospel, examples of missions, and the concept of small groups.

Distinctive Nature of the Church Ed Wharton A study of the New Testament's teaching about the church that Christ established, both in the first century and today. Topics covered include the pattern principle and the church's identity, leadership, and worship.
Life Time Credit

History and Nature of Christianity Jay Don Rogers This course provides an insightful and comprehensive overview of the foundations of Christianity and its message. Topics studied include the Biblical documents, the promise of a Messiah, the life and character of Jesus, the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus, the old and new covenants, the church, and post-apostolic church history.

Homiletics 1 Ed Wharton weeks-This course specifically addresses the powerful and awesome task of preaching. After discussing the identity, work, and power of a preacher, the instructor models and teaches the technique of outlining and explains several different types of sermons that can be preached. This course includes several recorded sermons as examples for the student to observe.
